Year 6 Visit to Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, London

The Globe Theatre



Year 6 have the very exciting opportunity to visit The Globe Theatre in London to watch a performance of Shakespeare's The Tempest on **Thursday 16th March 2023**.

Every year Shakespeare's Globe and Deutsche Bank stage a dynamic 90-minute production of a key curriculum text on the iconic stage of the Globe Theatre. It is created especially for young people and designed to help students from UKS2 upwards understand the work of William Shakespeare.

We have been very fortunate to obtain heavily subsidised tickets for this production: Deutsche Bank have contributed, and FUBS have also very kindly made a contribution of £10 per child towards the cost of the trip – thank you FUBS!

Visits really enhance the curriculum for the children, and we would love all of them to take part. This particular visit is a real treat for our Year 6 children. We are asking for a voluntary contribution of £19.00 please towards the cost of the performance tickets, transport and insurance, payable via sQuid before the event. If you will experience difficulty in making this payment, please talk to your child's teacher or Mr Andrews in confidence to discuss this. Sadly, if we don't receive enough contributions towards this event, we may have to cancel. Thank you for your continued support.

Children will need to wear full school uniform. They will also need a waterproof coat, packed lunch, and plenty to drink in a non-breakable container (no cans/glass bottles or fizzy drinks please). If your child has a hot meal booked on the day of the trip, please ensure that you contact Chartwells as soon as possible to cancel this.

The performance starts at 2:00pm so we will leave school at 11:00am to get there in plenty of time, and the children should return to school by 5:30pm. The office will keep you updated with a time of arrival back to school. If you wish your child to walk home on return to school, please email the office to advise, otherwise we will expect them to be collected.

If your child suffers from travel sickness, please collect a form from the office, and hand in together with the required medication on the morning of the visit.

You may be aware that the 16th March is a proposed industrial action day for teachers, but we have been assured that the trip will go ahead.
